Course overview

Having a child or loved one receive an autism diagnosis can be worrying and unsettling. It's difficult to know how best to support autistic children's needs without external guidance. This autism course can teach you how to offer support to help autistic young people live healthy and fulfilling lives. This taster course is ideal for you if you have regular contact with autistic children or teenagers. It is aimed at

parents, family members, community workers, or volunteers who interact closely with autistic kids. It can be useful both if you are going through diagnosis, and also if you feel you need extra resources to help support a developing autistic child.

Course description

During this equality & diversity course, you will study what autism is and how it affects child development. Understand the importance of routine and structure. Develop skills to communicate with autistic children and teens. Explore stigmas and stereotypes in society and learn how to approach the challenges these attitudes bring. Recognise behaviour that challenges and build up a toolkit to deal with it. Learn how to support positive behaviour.

If you're considering voluntary or job roles supporting autistic children, this course can help you understand the foundational principles.

Depending on your needs, there are many study options after this autism course. You can do further courses understanding autism or supporting young people.

If you're not sure which course is right for you, feel free to seek guidance from your tutor who will be happy to advise you.

Equality & Diversity courses are fundamental to ensure that the right support is given to autistic people in society.
