- Expand your vocabulary and learn to add descriptions with adjectives.

This is an entry 2 English course for adults. You will work on developing your writing skills.

You need foundational writing skills to take this course, that's why you'll need to do a skills check to enrol. Don't worry, this isn't an exam. It's for us to make sure you get on the right course for you.

Our friendly team will contact you to start your skills check as part of your booking.

When you complete this module, you can continue with other ESOL skills for life entry 2 courses. Once you finish the reading, writing, and speaking & listening courses, you can progress to entry 3 level.

There are also "Get Ready" courses between each module to prepare you for the next course.

This entry 2 ESOL writing course takes around 90 hours to complete.
