It can help you in a variety of contexts, for example in a voluntary or community role, or simply through social interactions. This course is aimed at intermediate learners. You will build on your existing BSL skills. If you would like to start from scratch, you can take the beginner's BSL course.

Course description

This intermediate British Sign Language course covers a variety of topics related to everyday language use. Learn to sign about your family, pets, numbers and colours. Further develop your skill at finger spelling. Continue to expand your awareness of different types of hearing impairment and the issues that affect deaf people.

When you complete this course, you can progress to higher-level BSL courses. The next course in this series is the Advanced British Sign Language (BSL) course.
