Course overview

This basic course will introduce learners to the world at work and the language needed to enter it. The course has been developed in partnership with Wolverhampton City Council which refers learners to this and other programmes hosted at the Old School, which is a community centre run by Blakenhall Action Community Forum. This course is particularly suitable for students are unemployed and have been referred by Job Centres to improve their spoken and written English and thereby get closer to getting a job.

Course description

"This is a Get Ready English course for adults which is a springboard to an Entry 1 course. You will work on basic speaking and listening skills. It's aimed at beginners so you don't need any much prior knowledge.

When you complete this module, you can continue with other ESOL courses at this level. Once you finish the reading, writing, and speaking & listening courses, you can progress to entry 1 level.

There are more "Get Ready" courses for each skill to prepare you for the next course.

This ESOL speaking and listening course takes around 48 hours to complete.

Please note that you will need an internet connection to study this English course for beginners. This is so you can access our digital learning platform called Canvas.

If you would like to learn digital skills for online learning, you can take our Canvas course for ESOL learners.
