- Seam finishes (e.g., French seams, flat-felled seams).
- Zipper insertions (invisible and lapped).
- Buttonholes and closures.
- 3. Understand fabric properties to make informed material choices.
- 4. Modify patterns to adjust fit and customize designs.
- 5. Complete several sewing projects, such as garments, home decor items, or accessories, showcasing their skills.
