When you complete this module, you can continue with other entry 2 ESOL courses. Once you finish the reading, writing, and speaking & listening courses, you can progress to entry 3 level. There are also "Get Ready" courses between each module to prepare you for the next course. Please note that you'll need an internet connection to study this ESOL course.
