St Stephen's Church, Harper Street, the Churchyard, the Turk's Head, Green's Place, Baring Street, Roman Fort, the Post Office shop, Roman Road, Fort Street, the Lawe Top, the Harbour, the Harbour Lights, and Mile End Road.

Matthew raised the subject of the Hanseatic League, and any North East connections to European trading routes. In the C13th and C14th, "Westphalian traders continued to dominate trade in London and also Ipswich and Colchester, while Baltic and Wendish traders concentrated between King's Lynn and Newcastle upon Tyne" - Wikepedia.
