Questions answered post-lecture

Q1 Did the Romans invade England in search of Cornish Tin or Gold?

The Romans certainly invaded Britain for its rich reserves of tin and gold, plus copper, iron, lead and silver. The tin came from Cornwall and the gold from Wales.

Q2 What heating material did they use in Scotland?

I am afraid I don't know the answer to this, but I would expect wood.

Q3 In Spanish, a lot of watermill vocuabulary comes from Arabic. Presumably the Arabs must have used water power a lot to power their irrigation?

Yes, the Arabs used waterwheels for irrigation and there is some evidence that watermills for other purposes were imported into Spain in the 12th century.
